2009 Legislature - Bill Alert Update By Rep. Dan Kristiansen Chamber of Commerce Report

In my April report to the chambers of commerce, I provided a bill alert listing several pieces of legislation that may affect businesses. Now that the 2009 Legislature adjourned its session on April 26, it's time to go back and look at the status of those and other bills.

Good business bills

Regulatory assistance: House Bill 1730 jump-starts the Office of Regulatory Assistance to help small businesses understand and comply with state agency rules and regulations. House Bill 1475 requires state agencies to provide a link on their home page to their rule-making activity. House Bill 1552 requires state agencies to allow public testimony during their meetings on rules and regulations. Senate Bill 5042 requires state agencies to waive fines, civil penalties or administrative sanctions for first-time paperwork violations by small businesses. These bills have been signed into law.

Agriculture: House Bill 1733 adds horse boarding to open space property tax exemptions. Senate Bill 5120 reduces permitting fees on farm structures. Senate Bill 5562 provides protections under the state's "Right to Farm" laws for the passive growing of timber.

Bad business bills

Taxes, fees and budget: Senate Bill 5104 and Senate Joint Resolution 8205 would have implemented an income tax in Washington. Fortunately, these bills never gained enough support to get a hearing. On the same day 5,000 people rallied against taxes at the Capitol, House Bill 2377 was introduced to increase the sales tax to pay for cuts in health care. That bill also died. The good news is the state budget did not contain these kinds of taxes. The bad news is the majority party increased fees by \$371 million. This includes a \$20 surcharge on document recording fees, an increase on hunting and fishing licenses, substantial college tuition increases, and a \$5 opt-out tax on your vehicle license tabs to pay for state parks.

Climate change: The big "cap and trade" legislation, Senate Bill 5735, that would make businesses pay to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, had initially passed both chambers, but fortunately, died in the final hours of the session when agreements could not be reached on amendments. Nevertheless, another measure establishing new "green building codes," Senate Bill 5854, was signed into law by the governor.

Home warranties: House Bill 1393 would have added new taxes, regulations and extensive warranty requirements upon residential home builders. This measure, which I opposed, passed the House, but died in the Senate.

Employer gag rule: Senate Bill 5446 and House Bill 1528 would have prohibited employers from communicating with employees about politics, charitable giving or unionizing. Both of these bills died.

Paid family leave - Senate Bill 6158 would borrow money from the Workers' Compensation Fund to pay for the set up of family leave insurance, despite the lack of a permanent funding source for the program. This bill was sent to the governor.

ARLINGTON SCHOOL NEWS

Arlington High School is proud to announce that two students; Nadia Arang and Jessie Rard have been selected for two highly competitive biomedical research fellowships.

Nadia Arang, a junior at Arlington High School, has been accepted by BioQuest Academy, offered through Seattle Biomedical Research Institute, for an intensive two week summer program. During the two weeks students will have the opportunity to practice lab skills and study how infectious diseases are transmitted. In addition, Arang will receive guidance for college choice and programs that lead to biomedical careers. The experience will also help her with future internships. Arang is currently taking AP chemistry and 4th year French among her other high school classes. Her future goals involve entering the healthcare field with a focus on those with inadequate medical care.

Jessie Rard, a freshman at Arlington High School, has been selected as one of ten Student Research Fellows in a two week summer fellowship with Northwest Association of Biomedical Research. During the two weeks students will have the opportunity to visit a variety of research institutions throughout the Seattle area. Rard's involvements with the research group will continue in her sophomore year with two meetings and then in the spring of 2010 she will present an original biomedical research project at the Student Biotech Expo in Seattle. The Expo "promotes science literacy and allows students to showcase work that reflects different aspects of biotechnology and biomedicine"(www.nwab.org/studentbiotech). Rard is currently taking advanced English, theatre arts, guitar, and is involved with the ROTC group. Rard is already thinking about her education after high school concentrating in biotech with the goal of working in a laboratory concentrating on biosafety.

Both Arang and Rard received full tuition for the workshops and \$400 to cover additional expenses. Arlington biology teacher Michelle Wolski nominated both students for the fellowships calling them "accomplished science students".

LAKWOOD SCHOOL NEWS

LHS 2009 VALEDICTORIAN AND SALUTATORIAN NAMES

The Valedictorian and Salutatorian is an academic honor based on the cumulative grade point average of the first seven semesters of high school. The intent is to recognize academic excellence, thus a student must be completed and/or be currently enrolled in the following classes to be eligible: Advanced Algebra/Trigonometry, Chemistry, Physics or Advanced Biology/Forensics, College Prep English, AP Honors U.S. History or AP Honors Government and have taken two years of a foreign language. The Valedictorian must be a student who has attended classes on the Lakewood High School campus for four consecutive semesters immediately prior to June graduation. During that time period, the Valedictorian must have attended at least half-time each semester earning a minimum of 1.5 credits per semester in LHS classes. The Valedictorian is the graduate with the highest cumulative grade point average who satisfies the criteria and the Salutatorian is the graduate with the second highest cumulative grade point average also satisfying the criteria. This year's Valedictorian is Kelsey Gann with a GPA of 3.971 and Cassie Czarnetzke is this year's Salutatorian with a GPA of 3.968.

Jennifer Mack, daughter of Mike and Jeanne Mack, is the winner of the Marysville Masonic Crystal Lodge #122 Outstanding Junior Award and a \$100 scholarship.
